# FOODBANK

One of the things I used to love when I lived opposite the sea was the fact that no matter how chaotic the sand looked after the visitors had gone at the end of the day a tide would come in and go out again leaving the beach all fresh and smooth again. The 'new normal' after Covid is providing a similar blank sheet permitting thoughtful change and new opportunities. I received an email from the Foodbank this week outlining their plans for remodelling their services for the future with the principle aim of working to reduce the reliance on the foodbank by developing projects to support people who find themselves caught in poverty. They invited comments and a vote on the suggestions for a change of name but sadly didn't get this out in time for me to be able to involve you. If anyone would like to read it, please ask and I'll forward it to you. Suffice to say though that the tide of Covid has enabled them to think more adventurously about the future.

Powdered Milk, Sponge Pudding, Coffee, Tinned Vegetables, Noodles (such as egg or rice noodles), Peanut butter, Mayonnaise, Milk UHT Semi & Full fat only, Pasta/Beans with Meat, Sugar (small, 500g bags, ideally), Long Life Fruit Juice, Meat (hot dogs, meatballs etc – not SPAM or corned beef), Tomato ketchup, Shaving Foam, Baby wash, Pump soap, Shower Gel, Washing powder and pods (bio and non-bio), Female deodorant, Male deodorant. *Polly Elder*

# 1<sup>st</sup> Reading Revelations 5: 6-12 read by Chris Redrup

Then I saw between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders a Lamb standing as if it had been slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. He went and took the scroll from the right hand of the one who was seated on the throne. When he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell before the Lamb, each holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. They sing a new song:

'You are worthy to take the scroll

and to open its seals,

for you were slaughtered and by your blood you ransomed for God

saints from every tribe and language and people and nation;

you have made them to be a kingdom and priests serving our God,

and they will reign on earth.'

Then I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, singing with full voice,

#### Rev. Geoff Andrew's Sermon Notes

Today is our third and final sermon on Prayer, looking at the A and Y in our P.R.A.Y. These stand for Ask and Yield.

Asking things of God for ourselves (petition) or others (intercessions) is at the heart of most prayer, as is the Lord's Prayer.

Scripture tells us to pray 'audaciously' in faith and expect God to answer.

Nothing is too big or too small to pray for (from 'Your kingdom come' to 'give us today our daily bread')

When we pray for others we should get:

- Informed (to pray knowledgeably),
- Inspired (to pray specifically),
  Indignant (to pray passionately)
- In sync (pray in accord with others)

What about unanswered prayer? Look at Jesus' example in Garden of Gethsemane: 'take this cup from me'

Ultimately we must accept God's world (it works a certain way), God's war (we are in a spiritual battle) and God's will.

Yield: Your will be done, not mine' – learning to be obedient and trust in his goodness.
