Last night I tried to recall some of the thought provoking videos which were circulated on social media at the beginning of the first lockdown, they focused on the damage in our society and world. I compared these to the news reports of thousands of containers of goods waiting to be transported around the country or even to be landed at ports all over the world at the moment. I had marvelled at the science which sent men into space for a ten minute look around but was aghast at the amount of fuel which was burnt up in the exercise. How I've wished that the messages in those thought provoking videos had stayed with us. I appreciate that I'm not looking at all the issues which

should be considered on these topics but just trying to work it all out in my head left me feeling confused and sad.

There is, however, one lesson which I think the whole country became aware of and has, thankfully, remained an urgent issue at the front of our minds; we learnt that there are many who struggle to keep the wolf from the door and how important community services like our Foodbank are just now. The numbers who need this help continue to rise. I keep boring you with requests for support and I appreciate that the congregation of St Johns has been extraordinarily generous but please, please do look at this list of needed items and see if you can provide just a little something to assist the Foodbank to support those who need our help at this time.

Reading 1 Nehemiah 2: 1-10

In the month of Nisan, in the twentieth year of King Artaxerxes, when wine was served to him, I carried the wine and gave it to the king. Now, I had never been sad in his presence before. So the king said to me, 'Why is your face sad, since you are not sick? This can only be sadness of the heart.' Then I was very

much afraid. I said to the king, 'May the king live for ever! Why should my face not be sad, when the city, the place of my ancestors' graves, lies waste, and its gates have been destroyed by fire?' Then the king said to me, 'What do you request?' So I prayed to the God of heaven. Then I said to the king, 'If it pleases the king, and if your servant has found favour with you, I ask that you send me to Judah, to the city of my ancestors' graves, so that I may rebuild it.' The king said to me (the queen also was sitting beside him), 'How long will you be gone, and when will you return?' So it pleased the king to send me, and I set him a date. Then I said to the king, 'If it pleases the king, let letters be given me to the governors of the province Beyond the River, that they may grant me passage until I arrive in Judah; and a letter to Asaph, the keeper of the king's forest, directing him to give me timber to make beams for the gates of the temple fortress, and for the wall of the city, and for the house that I shall occupy.' And the king granted me what I asked, for the gracious hand of my God was upon me.

Then I came to the governors of the province Beyond the River, and gave them the king's letters. Now the king had sent officers of the army and cavalry with me. When Sanballat the Horonite and Tobiah the Ammonite official heard this, it displeased them greatly that someone had come to seek the welfare of the people of Israel.

Reading 2 Mark 10: 35-45

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, 'Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you.' And he said to them, 'What is it you want me to do for you?' And they said to him, 'Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory.' But Jesus said to them, 'You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?' They replied, 'We are able.' Then Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared.'

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, 'You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many.'
