FOODBANK

Some time back I talked about each of us doing our bit in our own small corner.

I have a friend who is a lecturer at The College of Transfiguration in Grahamstown South Africa; he has just sent information about the Foodbank there, Ithemba Le Kamva -Hope For The Future. I thought you might be interested to hear a bit about it. They can only work with monetary donations and with them supply food parcels to families who are unable to adequately feed themselves. They currently distribute food parcels every third week. Each parcel costs approximately R120 (£5.86) to make up and consists of a tin of baked beans, two candles, bags of flour and yeast, samp (dried corn kernels, not so finely ground as mealie-meal) and beans, a few tea bags, salt soup, soap, a bag of rice, mealie-meal(coarse maize) and sugar. They distribute 160 parcels which impact the lives of approximately 800 men. women and children. To those people who do not receive parcels, they give peanut butter sandwiches. They purchase 80 loaves of bread and 11kg of peanut butter from a local supermarket to produce the sandwiches.

Interesting isn't it to note the similarities and differences.

1st Reading Nehemiah 4: 1-14 read by Tim Rogers

Now when Sanballat heard that we were building the wall, he was angry and greatly enraged, and he mocked the Jews. He said in the presence of his associates and of the army of Samaria, 'What are these feeble Jews doing? Will they restore things? Will they sacrifice? Will they finish it in a day? Will they revive the stones out of the heaps of rubbish—and burnt ones at that?' Tobiah the Ammonite was beside him, and he said, 'That stone wall they are building—any fox going up on it would break it down!' Hear, O our God, for we are despised; turn their taunt back on their own heads, and give them over as plunder in a land of captivity. Do not cover their guilt, and do not let their sin be blotted out from your sight; for they have hurled insults in the face of the builders.

So we rebuilt the wall, and all the wall was joined together to half its height; for the people had a mind to work.

But when Sanballat and Tobiah and the Arabs and the Ammonites and the Ashdodites heard that the repairing of the walls of Jerusalem was going forward and the gaps were beginning to be closed, they were very angry, and all plotted together to come and fight against Jerusalem and to cause confusion in it. So we prayed to our God, and set a guard as a protection against them day and night.

But Judah said, 'The strength of the burden-bearers is failing, and there is too much rubbish, so that we are unable to work on the wall.' And our enemies said, 'They will not know or see anything before we come upon them and kill them and stop the work.' When the Jews who lived near them came, they said to us ten times, 'From all the places where they live they will come up against us.' So in the lowest parts of the space behind the wall, in open places, I stationed the people according to their families, with their swords, their spears, and their bows. After I looked these things over, I stood up and said to the nobles and the officials and the rest of the people, 'Do not be afraid of them. Remember the Lord, who is great and awesome, and fight for your kin, your sons, your daughters, your wives, and your homes.'

Gospel Reading John 17: 10-19 read by Tim Rogers

All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.
