FOODBANK

Part 2 of the latest news from the Foodbank.

For us here at Epsom & Ewell Foodbank, we still desire to one day be able close the foodbank due to there being no demand for it, but until that is possible we will do what we can to support people to rebuild their lives. Alongside our many and amazing volunteers, we have expanded our staff team, mainly with support from Trussell Trust. This has allowed us to look optimistically towards 2022 and beyond as we work towards our vision to 'Lead our community towards a poverty-free future while supporting those who need our help. 'Therefore 2022 is already looking exciting and we will not let Omicron (or another Covid variant) detract from the vital work of supporting people in poverty. We will be launching some exciting new projects including a 'Food pantry' in Epsom. We will also be building on the success of our existing work, by looking to run the second phase of the East Surrey Poverty Truth Commission. We are in the process of establishing a new charitable trust to ensure we can deliver our future vision and we'll be sharing more news about this with you soon.

This week they have several URGENTLY NEEDED items: Breakfast cereal (not porridge, we have lots), Custard, Longlife sponge puddings, Instant mash, Squash, Tinned meat pies, Longlife fruit juice, Washing powder, pods and tablets - bio and non-bio, Children's toothpaste, Shaving foam.

They ALSO NEED:- Pasta sauce, Tea bags, UHT milk (full fat and semi skimmed only please), Dried pasta and sauce, Packet soup, Tinned spaghetti in sauce, Nappies size 3, Toilet roll, Shampoo, Sanitary pads.

Please no more of these items as we are fully stocked: Pulses, pasta, noodles, sweetcorn, rice, beans, tampons, washing up liquid, shower gel, coffee, porridge, baby wash and shampoo, hot chocolate, tinned tomatoes.

CONCERTS

The concert series at St Mary's Ewell for 2022 is now available on the church website at www.stmarysewell.com.

The series begins next Tuesday 11th January with Bach from 1.05pm to 1.35pm followed by tea and cake.

Tuesday's concert features Chorale Preludes BWV 616 and 617 related to the Epiphany story of Simeon and the Nunc Dimittis, as well as one of Bach's grandest Preludes and Fugues. The Prelude and Fugue in B minor may have been premiered by Bach in St Paul's Church in Leipzig. That is where, on 17 October 1727, the university held a memorial service for the recently departed Queen of Poland. During the ceremony, Bach played the organ himself. He opened with a

prelude and ended with a fugue, and although nobody can prove it, it seems highly likely that it was this monumental piece.

Gospel Reading Matthew 2 v1-12 read by Maggie Savill

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi[a] from the east came to Jerusalem 2 and asked, 'Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.' 3 When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. 4 When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. 5 'In Bethlehem in Judea,' they replied, 'for this is what the prophet has written:

6 "But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler

who will shepherd my people Israel."[b]'

7 Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. 8 He sent them to Bethlehem and said, 'Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.'

9 After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. 10 When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. 11 On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshipped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.
