Introduction

 Conclusion of our journey through 2000 years of church history, beginning with the Acts of the Apostles; uncovering the deliberations and influence of the Church Fathers; travelling the road to the Reformation through the dark and middle ages; two weeks ago looked at the legacy of the Reformation in the work of the Reformers; the Romans; the Radicals and the Revivalists- individuals who changed the spiritual landscape of the West. Last week we explored the century of change covering the period roughly from 1850-1950

1. The Landscape of these Times!

- The Enlightenment has spawned two false dawns
- (a) The rise of theological liberalism
- The 19th Century Enlightenment- period of scientific rationalism where the new gods of science and technology were worshippedmore of this in a moment- the churches response to this was an emasculated form of the Gospel called liberalism whereby the virgin birth, the miracles and the supremely the bodily resurrection of Jesus Christ were challenged, reinterpreted or even discarded
- (b) The death of the "progress myth"
- Education and human progress will solve all our problems

2 The Legacy of these Times (a) Post Modernism

Series of shifts in the way that people think and act- they do it without thinking- we have been socially conditioned

- We have moved from a God centred view of life, the universe and everything to a man centred view
- 2. We have moved from a collective perspective to an individual perspective
- 3. We have moved from collective responsibility to personal autonomy
- 4. We have moved from a Big Story to a series of side shows
- 5. We have moved from public morality and truth to privatised morality and truth (shop around in the supermarket of truth)
- 6. We have moved from singularism to pluralism
- 7. We have moved from certainty to doubt -"apocalyptic doubt



(b) The Age of Aquarius – New Age Spirituality

 A cocktail of Eastern mysticism and religious practice; pre Christian superstitions and the occult. Matters of belief are settled by a "pick and mix" approach creating a continually changing concoction of the beliefs that we like
