# **FOODBANK**

Listening to the news tonight it implied that everyone down here is rich and comfortable. Having lived in the North for 25 years I would agree that there is a disgraceful gap in living conditions between North to South. Please do not think though that everyone in this area is comfortable - there are some very real fears and desperate situations in our community. We cannot change everything all at once but St Johns is committed to helping out in 'our small corner'. If your own situation is a little tight please do not feel obliged or guilty if you cannot help with these lists - we support the foodbank in prayer too and your help with this would be much appreciated.

The Foodbank has completely run out of: Powdered milk, Nappies - size 5, size 5+, size 6 and size 6+, Household cleaning products - antibac spray, cleaning wipes, oven cleaner etc. (No bleach please!), Tinned soup, Tea bags.

They also **urgently need**: Cooking sauce, Tinned meat, Long life fruit juice, Tinned veg, Noodles, Biscuits, Sponge puddings, Jam, Chocolate/Treats, Adult toothbrushes (Singles please, No packs of two or more.

Please no more of these items as they are fully stocked: Pulses, pasta, beans, washing up liquid, cat food, dog food, peanut butter, non-dairy milk.

# Ephesians 6:10-13

<sup>10</sup> Finally, be strong in the Lord and in his mighty power. <sup>11</sup> Put on the full armour of God, so that you can take your stand against the devil's schemes. <sup>12</sup> For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms. <sup>13</sup> Therefore put on the full armour of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to stand your ground, and after you have done everything, to stand.

This is the word of the Lord **Thanks be to God** 

Mark 14:32-42

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark. Glory to you, O Lord.

- 32 They went to a place called Gethsemane, and Jesus said to his disciples, 'Sit here while I pray.' 33 He took Peter, James and John along with him, and he began to be deeply distressed and troubled. 34 'My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death,' he said to them. 'Stay here and keep watch.'
- 35 Going a little farther, he fell to the ground and prayed that if possible the hour might pass from him. 36 'Abba, Father,' he said, 'everything is possible for you. Take this cup from me. Yet not what I will, but what you will.'
- 37 Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. 'Simon,' he said to Peter, 'are you asleep? Couldn't you keep watch for one hour? 38 Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak.'
- 39 Once more he went away and prayed the same thing. 40 When he came back, he again found them sleeping, because their eyes were heavy. They did not know what to say to him.
- 41 Returning the third time, he said to them, 'Are you still sleeping and resting? Enough! The hour has come. Look, the Son of Man is delivered into the hands of sinners. 42 Rise! Let us go! Here comes my betrayer!' (Mark 14:32-42)
