## CHRISTMAS AND EPIPHANY

#### Introduction to the season

The period from Christmas to Candlemas (The presentation of Christ in the Temple) is a festive season when we reflect on the coming of Jesus Christ into the world and the revelation of his glory in the heart of our humanity.

At Christmas we celebrate our Lord's birth, the Word made flesh, also known as the Incarnation. It is a time of great joy as we ponder on the wonder of Christ, the Light of the World, dispelling the darkness.

The *Feast of the Epiphany*, celebrated on 6th of January, traditionally told in the journey of the Magi, speaks of the ways in which Christ's presence is still revealed to us today as, like them, we seek him.

Candlemas is a pivotal feast, ending the 40 days of Christmas and the Epiphany. Alongside the theme of light in Simeon's words in Luke 2.29 - 32 (known as the Nunc Dimittis) as he cradled the infant Jesus in his arms, 'Lord, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word: for my eyes have seen your salvation which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for the glory of your people Israel... here is also his warning of Jesus' destiny, (Luke 2.34,35) and he said to Mary... and a sword will pierce your own soul too'.

So, we turn our faces away from his birth towards the path to Calvary.

#### The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father; God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the Prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.
