#### A MESSAGE FROM REV. GEOFF ANDREW

This week we start a new sermon series called Fit for the Future based on Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians. It's a fairly short book so I encourage you to read it in one sitting to get a sense of the overall situation in the young church of Thessalonica. You can also check out The Bible Project overview on YouTube. 1 Thessalonians asks and answers some significant questions that are still very relevant today: is it possible for Christian faith to survive and thrive in an indifferent or even hostile world? What does such a faith look like – at home, at work, wherever we find ourselves? And what kind of church does it take to sustain that vision? I hope you will find much to savour as we explore one of Paul's most endearing letters.

# Fit for the Future: What Truly Matters. (1 Thessalonians 1:1-10)

In this opening sermon, we will spend a little time talking about the background to the letter and the situation in Thessalonica (based on Acts 17). We then focus on Paul's opening words which are full of thanksgiving and encouragement. He enthuses about how well the church is doing in faithfully following Jesus to such an extent that their reputation is spoken of in glowing terms throughout the region. Now there's a challenge for us!

# Readings

1 Thessalonians 1: 1-10

1 Paul, Silas and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace and peace to you. <sup>2</sup> We always thank God for all of you and continually mention you in our prayers. <sup>3</sup> We remember before our God and Father your work produced by faith, your labour prompted by love, and your endurance inspired by hope in our Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>4</sup> For we know, brothers and sisters loved by God, that he has chosen you, 5 because our gospel came to you not simply with words but also with power, with the Holy Spirit and deep conviction. You know how we lived among you for your sake. 6 You became imitators of us and of the Lord, for you welcomed the message in the midst of severe suffering with the joy given by the Holy Spirit, <sup>7</sup> And so you became a model to all the believers in Macedonia and Achaia. 8 The Lord's message rang out from you not only in Macedonia and Achaia - your faith in God has become known everywhere. Therefore we do not need to say anything about it, 9 for they themselves report what kind of reception you gave us. They tell how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, 10 and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead -Jesus, who rescues us from the coming wrath.

<sup>13</sup> 'You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. <sup>14</sup> 'You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. <sup>15</sup> Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. <sup>16</sup> In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.
