Today's Service

Fit for the Future: Modelling not Meddling. (1 Thess 4:9-12) For us as for the Thessalonians, we are called to live faithfully not just in the home or at church, but also in the wider world. Now as then, how we conduct ourselves as Christians matching our words and our actions - is vitally important if we are to be seen as people of integrity. According to this passage, we should seek to live a life that pleases God, within the context of love for fellow believers, and a missional concern for the wider world. This passage also contains one of Paul's most surprising instructions: 'make it your ambition to lead a quiet life'!

1 Thessalonians 4: 9-12

⁹ Now about your love for one another we do not need to write to you, for you yourselves have been taught by God to love each other. ¹⁰ And in fact, you do love all of God's family throughout Macedonia. Yet we urge you, brothers and sisters, to do so more and more, ¹¹ and to make it your ambition to lead a quiet life: you should mind your own business and work with your hands, just as we told you, ¹² so that your daily life may win the respect of outsiders and so that you will not be dependent on anybody.

³⁸ 'You have heard that it was said, "Eye for eye, and tooth for tooth." ³⁹ But I tell you, do not resist an evil person. If anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to them the other cheek also. ⁴⁰ And if anyone wants to sue you and take your shirt, hand over your coat as well. ⁴¹ If anyone forces you to go one mile, go with them two miles. ⁴² Give to the one who asks you, and do not turn away from the one who wants to borrow from you. 43 'You have heard that it was said, "Love your neighbour and hate your enemy." 44 But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? 48 Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect.
