This Sunday is Mothering Sunday, traditionally celebrated in the UK on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent. The origins of the occasion lie in the Middle Ages, when children who had left their families to work in domestic service were allowed to go to their home – or "mother" – church. We often refer to the day as Mother's Day, though this celebration of motherhood is a 20<sup>th</sup> century US invention which many countries mark later in the Spring. Mothering Sunday can be a bittersweet day depending on our own circumstances, but it is a day when we celebrate the best of motherhood and give thanks to God for his constant and unfailing love for us. Join us at 9.30am or 11am.

# **Today's Service**

Resurrection Road: Going for Glory? (Matthew 20: 20-23)

For this week's gospel reading, we're switching from Mark to Matthew. Both gospel writers tell the same story of how the disciples James and John petitioned Jesus to be in places of honour in his kingdom. The difference between the two accounts is that in Matthew's version, it is James and John's mother who makes the first approach to Jesus. On this Mothering Sunday, it's fitting that we should consider the actions of a mother who wanted only the best for her children.

1 Kings 1: 11-15, 28-31

<sup>11</sup> Then Nathan asked Bathsheba, Solomon's mother, 'Have you not heard that Adonijah, the son of Haggith, has become king, and our lord David knows nothing about it? <sup>12</sup> Now then, let me advise you how you can save your own life and the life of your son Solomon. <sup>13</sup> Go in to King David and say to him, "My lord the king, did you not swear to me your servant: 'Surely Solomon your son shall be king after me, and he will sit on my throne'? Why then has Adonijah become king?" <sup>14</sup> While you are still there talking to the king, I will come in and add m<sup>15</sup> So Bathsheba went to see the aged king in his room, where Abishag the Shunammite was attending him.

<sup>28</sup> Then King David said, 'Call in Bathsheba.' So she came into the king's presence and stood before him. <sup>29</sup> The king then took an oath: 'As surely as the LORD lives, who has delivered me out of every trouble, <sup>30</sup> I will surely carry out this very day what I swore to you by the LORD, the God of Israel: Solomon your son shall be king after me, and he will sit on my throne in my place. <sup>31</sup> Then Bathsheba bowed down with her face to the ground, prostrating herself before the king, and said, 'May my lord King David live for ever!'

<sup>20</sup> Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favour of him. <sup>21</sup> 'What is it you want?' he asked. She said, 'Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom.' <sup>22</sup> 'You don't know what you are asking,' Jesus said to them. 'Can you drink the cup I am going to drink?' 'We can,' they answered.<sup>23</sup> Jesus said to them, 'You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father.'
