Introduction to the season

The Great Fifty Days of Eastertide form a single festival period in which the tone of joy created on Easter day is sustained through the following seven weeks, and the Church celebrates the gloriously risen Christ:

Alleluias feature frequently in orders of service and hymns, and white or gold are often used to emphasise the joy and brightness of the season.

On the fortieth day there has from the late fourth century been a particular celebration of Christ's ascension. He commissions his disciples to continue his work, he promises the gift of the Holy Spirit, and then he is no longer among them in the flesh.

The ascension is therefore closely connected with the theme of mission.

The arrival of the promised gift of the Holy Spirit ten days later on the day of Pentecost completes and crowns, the Easter Festival

Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures; he was buried; he was raised to life on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures; afterwards he appeared to his followers, and to all the apostles: this we have received, and this we believe. Amen.

The risen Christ came and stood among his disciples and said, 'Peace be with you.' Then were they glad when they saw the Lord. Alleluia!

The peace of the Lord be always with you. And also with you!

The Prayer at the Preparation of the Table

Lord of life, with unbounded joy we offer you our sacrifice of praise. As we come to your table, may we know your resurrection power; through Christ our risen Lord. Amen. Please sit

The Eucharistic Prayer - the Prayer of Thanksgiving

The Lord is here. **His Spirit is with us.**

Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself.

When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in your Son. You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us. He opened his arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends he took bread, and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to them, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me. **Father, we do this in remembrance of him: his body is the bread of life.**

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins; do this in remembrance of me. **Father, we do this in remembrance of him: his blood is shed for all.**

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory, send your Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son. As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us one in Christ, our risen Lord.

With your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of praise and lift our voice to join the eternal song of heaven

saying

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

The Lord's Prayer

As our Saviour taught us, so we pray

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Breaking of the Bread

Lord, we died with you on the cross. Now we are raised to new life.

We were buried in your tomb.

Now we share in your resurrection. Invitation to Communion

If you are thirsty, come drink the fount of life If you are hungry, come eat the bread of life Blessed are all who hunger for this bread and thirst for this fount

Alleluia! Christ our passover is sacrificed for us. Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

Giving of Communion

If you are coming for a blessing, please keep your hands by your side.

If you would like us to bring Communion to you in your seat, please let one of our welcomers know.

God of truth, we have seen with our eyes and touched with our hands the bread of life: strengthen our faith that we may grow in love for you and for each other; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen
