Today's Service

Resurrection Road: Can you believe it? (Mark 16:9-20)

Most commentators agree that the final verses of Mark's gospel were not written by Mark but were a later addition. However, they are perfectly complementary to the other gospels in highlighting the initial scepticism of the disciples who had not yet seen the risen Jesus, yet ultimately galvanised by his command to 'preach the gospel to all creation.' The final verse describes how Jesus 'worked with them', a partnership that still underpins the mission of the church to this day. Are you on board?

Reading

Mark 16:9-20

⁹ When Jesus rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had driven seven demons. 10 She went and told those who had been with him and who were mourning and weeping. 11 When they heard that Jesus was alive and that she had seen him, they did not believe it. 12 Afterwards Jesus appeared in a different form to two of them while they were walking in the country. 13 These returned and reported it to the rest; but they did not believe them either. 14 Later Jesus appeared to the Eleven as they were eating; he rebuked them for their lack of faith and their stubborn refusal to believe those who had seen him after he had risen. 15 He said to them, 'Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. ¹⁶ Whoever believes and is baptised will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned. 17 And these signs will accompany those who believe: in my name they will drive out demons; they will speak in new tongues; 18 they will pick up snakes with their hands; and when they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all; they will place their hands on people who are ill, and they will get well.' 19 After the Lord Jesus had spoken to them, he was taken up into heaven and he sat at the right hand of God. ²⁰ Then the disciples went out and preached everywhere, and the Lord worked with them and confirmed his word by the signs that accompanied it.
