This was unanimously agreed by the PCC at the last meeting. The small cups we have been using were only ever a temporary measure for Covid/lockdown. If anyone feels uncomfortable drinking from the chalice, you can still come forward for Communion and take the bread/wafer only. Please note we will not be offering intinction (dipping the wafer). Nonalcoholic wine will continue to be available. If you have any concerns about this, please speak to myself or the wardens.

#### Sunday's Services Today's Service

**Resurrection Road: The World has Changed (Mark 16:1-8)** Mark's account of the resurrection is almost certainly missing its original last page. Nevertheless, in just a few verses he manages to capture the confusion, the alarm, the sheer terror of those women who gathered early on that Sunday morning to find an empty tomb and an angelic figure declaring Jesus had risen from the dead. The women who fled 'trembling and bewildered' from the tomb were the first witnesses to a new chapter in world history. Jesus, risen, changes everything. Has he changed you?

#### <u>Reading</u> Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. <sup>2</sup> Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb<sup>3</sup> and they asked each other, 'Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?' <sup>4</sup>But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. <sup>5</sup> As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. <sup>6</sup> 'Don't be alarmed,' he said. 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. 7 But go, tell his disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you. 8 Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.
