### Today's Services Trinity Sunday

Jesus told Nicodemus, a Pharisee, that 'no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again.' The phrase 'born again Christian' has taken on some unfortunate fundamentalist connotations in recent decades, but an understanding of Jesus' teaching is key to our identity as followers of Christ. This Sunday we will see how Jesus' encounter with Nicodemus help us to understand the meaning of being born again and how this relates to our life with God within the Trinity.

#### Readings

Proverbs 8: 22-31 John Rogers

<sup>22</sup> 'The LORD brought me forth as the first of his works, before his deeds of old; <sup>23</sup>I was formed long ages ago, at the very beginning, when the world came to be. <sup>24</sup> When there were no watery depths, I was given birth, when there were no springs overflowing with water; <sup>25</sup> before the mountains were settled in place, before the hills, I was given birth, <sup>26</sup> before he made the world or its fields or any of the dust of the earth. 27 I was there when he set the heavens in place, when he marked out the horizon on the face of the deep, 28 when he established the clouds above and fixed securely the fountains of the deep, <sup>29</sup> when he gave the sea its boundary so that the waters would not overstep his command, and when he marked out the foundations of the earth. 30 Then I was constantly at his side. I was filled with delight day after day, rejoicing always in his presence. 31 rejoicing in his whole world and delighting in the human race.

John 3: 1-16 Rev. Geoff Andrew

3 Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. <sup>2</sup> He came to Jesus at night and said, 'Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him.' 3 Jesus replied, 'Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again]' 4'How can someone be born when they are old?' Nicodemus asked. 'Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!' 5 Jesus answered, 'Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. <sup>6</sup> Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. 7 You should not be surprised at my saying, "You must be born again." 8 The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit.'9 'How can this be?' Nicodemus asked.10 'You are Israel's teacher,' said Jesus, 'and do you not understand these things? 11 Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. 12 I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? <sup>13</sup> No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven - the Son of Man. 14 Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, 15 that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.' 16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.
