# UKRAINE CRISIS APPEAL

Thank you so much to St John's church who are still helping the people of Ukraine 18 months after the start of the war. According the UN Refugee Council, there are 5.1 million internally displaced people in Ukraine as of May 2023 and more than 6.2 million people have crossed into neighbouring countries including Poland. Poland has welcomed 60 per cent of all refugees from Ukraine. The Polish White Eagle club in Balham will continue to send lorries to Poland and Ukraine for as long as people donate supplies. Many Ukrainians are living in damaged homes and buildings ill-prepared for another winter. As the war continues, humanitarian needs are growing and we estimate that 17.6 million people in Ukraine will need help to survive the forthcoming winter and the freezing temperatures.

If you can donate: shower gel, shampoo, soap, sanitary items, nappies, warm socks, protein bars, packet soups, first aid kits, toothbrushes, toothpaste, torches, bandages and warm gloves, or anything else listed on the donation box in the church, you will be helping people survive in Ukraine. If you wish to donate money, please either write a cheque made payable to Shelly Weiczorek, go to the whiteeagleappeal.org page or put cash in an envelope marked Ukraine. We can then buy chest drains and other medical equipment that is not easy to buy in shops. Thanks for all your support. *Shelly, Ukrainian Refugee Contact*

## **Today's Services**

The story of Noah's Ark is so familiar to us that it's become part of the cultural landscape. Even people who don't have any knowledge of God or the Bible have at least a passing knowledge of the man who built a huge boat and rescued all the earth's animals 'two by two' to protect them from the terrible flood. Ah yes, the flood that wiped out all the life on earth that wasn't on the ark. What are we to make of this devastating act of God? The story of Noah's Ark tells us a great deal about the God of love who is also a God of justice. Sometimes we forget that he is both, but the coming of Jesus Christ only makes sense if we understand this aspect of God's character.

#### Readings Genesis 6: 9-17; 9: 8-15)

<sup>9</sup>This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God. <sup>10</sup> Noah had three sons: Shem, Ham and Japheth. <sup>11</sup> Now the earth was corrupt in God's sight and was full of violence. <sup>12</sup> God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways. <sup>13</sup> So God said to Noah, 'I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them. I am surely going to destroy both them and the earth. <sup>14</sup> So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out. <sup>15</sup> This is how you are to build it: the ark is to be three hundred cubits long, fifty cubits wide and thirty cubits high. <sup>16</sup> Make a roof for it, leaving below the roof an opening one cubit high all around.<sup>[d]</sup> Put a door in the side of the ark and make lower, middle and upper decks. <sup>17</sup> I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish.

<sup>8</sup>Then God said to Noah and to his sons with him: <sup>9</sup> 'I now establish my covenant with you and with your descendants after you <sup>10</sup> and with every living creature that was with you - the birds, the livestock and all the wild animals, all those that came out of the ark with you - every living creature on earth. <sup>11</sup> I establish my covenant with you: never again will all life be destroyed by the waters of a flood; never again will there be a flood to destroy the earth.' <sup>12</sup> And God said, 'This is the sign of the covenant I am making between me and you and every living creature with you, a covenant for all generations to come: <sup>13</sup> I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth. <sup>14</sup> Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, <sup>15</sup> I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life.

<sup>36</sup> 'But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 37 As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>38</sup> For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; <sup>39</sup> and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. <sup>40</sup> Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. <sup>41</sup> Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left. 42 'Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come.
