Harvest Festival Church Service

October 1st – 10:00am



Harvest is a time when traditionally we thank God for his provision of the crops that we bring in from the fields. Such rural imagery doesn't resonate quite the same way in suburban Stoneleigh. However, at a time when many people in our wider community are struggling to put food on the table, it is right to give thanks for our own daily food and support those who are not so fortunate.



The Trussell Trust, which is the biggest provider of foodbanks in this country, says that close to 3 million emergency food parcels were distributed by their network in the year to March 2023 — the most parcels ever distributed by them in a year. The number of people that used a foodbank for the first time in that same period was 760,000.

St John's is proud to support the Epsom & Ewell Foodbank. There is a collection box just inside the church doors which is always available for donations. The Harvest Festival church service on October 1st is a day when we make a special effort to bring gifts which we will distribute on your behalf.*

The Start! course


October 3rd – 7:30pm (weekly for six weeks)

Have you ever wondered what the Christian faith is all about?

Start! introduces Christianity through six interactive, small-group sessions. The Start! course makes no assumptions about participants' background or experience or knowledge of Christianity or the church. It really does start from scratch.

Each session lasts about 90 minutes and is based around short, lively video clips, down-to-earth 'vox pop' interviews and settings which include Blackpool beach, a fun fair, shopping centre and a junk yard, all designed to prompt lively discussion. There's time to chat and space for reflection - all in a style that aims to be honest and enjoyable.

Remembering Loved Ones Church Service

October 29th – 3:00pm

This is a special church service of thanksgiving to remember those we have loved and lost. It is quiet and reflective, allowing space to grieve and an opportunity to light a candle in memoriam.

The tradition of such a service is tied to the November 1st and November 2nd commemorations of All Saints Day (or All Hallows Day, hence the day prior being All Hallows Eve or Hallow'een) and All Souls Day respectively. This is a time in the church calendar set aside to honour the saints and remember all who have recently died. The word 'hallow' means saintly or holy.

The Remembering Loved Ones service is open to everyone, whether or not your loved one (or you) professed a Christian faith.

If you are planning to attend, you may choose to have the name of your loved one read out during the service if the information is received by the church office at least one week prior to the service.

Remembrance Sunday is an annual opportunity to reflect and take stock. If we are to truly honour the fallen, then we have to continually revisit the lessons that these terrible conflicts have taught us and acknowledge our responsibility to maintain and build on the peace and freedom that others fought so hard to achieve.

Our service begins in the church and then moves outside to the Garden of Remembrance where the bugler will play the Last Post and we observe the two minute silence. Wreaths will be laid by church officials, members of the uniformed organisations and veterans.

Waiting is hard, especially when we are in distress. God will come to our aid, but it may be in a different way to what we expect.

The thing about Jesus is that He has never given up on me. He stays by my side through thick and thin, till eventually His light shines in my heart and hope is rekindled.

May the light of Christmas bring hope into your lives.

Spotlight on... Volunteering

Research has shown that people who volunteer are happier, healthier and can even live longer. As a volunteer for a number of organisations I feel that I am making a difference, albeit in a small way and whilst it is a commitment, I do not find that volunteering is onerous or takes up too much of my time. I really enjoy it.

For example, one morning a week I visit an elderly lady as a befriender for Age Concern Epsom & Ewell. This entails sitting in her lounge and having a good old gossip over a cup of tea. I usually stay for 90 minutes to 2 hours as we find such a lot to chat about. I recently signed up as a telephone befriender for Age UK where, once a week I telephone a 92 year old gentleman and chat to him for 30 minutes. This is done in the comfort of my own home and again, I get great pleasure having a good old chat and hearing about his life.

The reason I volunteer for ACEE and Age UK is that approximately 1.2 million older people across the UK often feel lonely and isolated. There are many people in our neighbourhood who go unnoticed behind closed doors, yearning for someone to speak to. Half a million older people go at least 5 or 6 days a week without seeing or speaking to anyone. In the last year I have got involved with helping St John's Church with events and other activities, I've been able to put my skills and expertise to good use and I've made some new friends.



There are many organisations in the local area that depend on the help from volunteers. The list is long, but for example Stoneleigh and Auriol Residents Association, local churches, Age Concern Epsom & Ewell, charity shops, libraries, Stoneleigh Job Club, and Epsom & Ewell Food Bank. I do urge you, if you have a few hours to spare a week please sign up as a volunteer, you will make a difference and hopefully you will enjoy it.


