Today's Services

In the second in our Advent sermon series, The Whole Christmas Story, our attention turns to the state of the world and of humanity. 'Broken' sums things up rather well. Whilst we all want to enjoy the light and joy of Christmas, as Christians we have to acknowledge and give name to the suffering that continues to go on all around us, and often within us. As we said last week, Jesus represents God's great rescue mission

for the world, but we are faced with a darker reality until that day when he comes again. Our challenge is to be messengers of hope when faced with despair.

Readings

Psalm 6

¹ LORD, do not rebuke me in your anger or discipline me in your wrath. ² Have mercy on me, LORD, for I am faint; heal me, LORD, for my bones are in agony. ³My soul is in deep anguish. How long, LORD, how long? ⁴ Turn, LORD, and deliver me; save me because of your unfailing love. ⁵ Among the dead no one proclaims your name. Who praises you from his grave? ⁶ I am worn out from my groaning. All night long I flood my bed with weeping and drench my couch with tears. ⁷ My eyes grow weak with sorrow; they fail because of all my foes. ⁸ Away from me, all you who do evil, for the LORD has heard my weeping. ⁹The LORD has heard my cry for mercy; the LORD accepts my prayer. ¹⁰ All my enemies will be overwhelmed with shame and anguish; they will turn back and suddenly be put to shame.

John 15:18-25

¹⁸ 'If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first. ¹⁹ If you belonged to the world, it would love you as its own. As it is, you do not belong to the world, but I have chosen you out of the world. That is why the world hates you. ²⁰ Remember what I told you: "A servant is not greater than his master."[a] If they persecuted me, they will persecute you also. If they obeyed my teaching, they will obey yours also.²¹ They will treat you this way because of my name, for they do not know the one who sent me. ²² If I had not come and spoken to them, they would not be guilty of sin; but now they have no excuse for their sin. ²³ Whoever hates me hates my Father as well. ²⁴ If I had not done among them the works no one else did, they would not be guilty of sin. As it is, they have seen, and yet they have hated both me and my Father. ²⁵ But this is to fulfil what is written in their Law: "They hated me without reason."
