FOODBANK

What are the six P's? They are the distinctive values of the support work undertaken by the Good Company which is the overall group of which the Foodbank is one part. The aim is to provide Food in a crisis but also advice and support which will enable the clients of the Foodbank to cope with the complex issues which they face at the same time as struggling to afford food and other essentials. We contribute to the beginning of this work by supporting the foodbank but there is much more to discover about the support that goes alongside it. This week the Foodbank urgently needs:- Sugar in 500g bags, Noodles (not super or pot), Male deodorant, Powdered milk.

They also need:- Nappies 5, 6 and 6 plus, Instant Coffee, Tinned Tomatoes, Tinned Spaghetti in tomato sauce, Crisps, Ketchup, Brown Sauce, Mayo, Shaving foam/gel, Washing up Liquid.

¹¹ Do not speak evil against one another, brothers and sisters. Whoever speaks evil against another or judges another, speaks evil against the law and judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law but a judge. ¹² There is one lawgiver and judge who is able to save and to destroy. So who, then, are you to judge your neighbour? ¹³ Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a town and spend a year there, doing business and making money.' ¹⁴ Yet you do not even know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes. ¹⁵ Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wishes, we will live and do this or that.' ¹⁶ As it is, you boast in your arrogance; all such boasting is evil. ¹⁷ Anyone, then, who knows the right thing to do and fails to do it, commits sin.

How can you speak good things, when you are evil?
