PRAYERS OF LOVE AND FAITH

If you were in church on June 16, you will have heard me announce that St John's PCC, with my support, has made a unanimous decision to endorse the Prayers of Love and Faith (PLF) that were issued late last year by the Church of England. The PLF are essentially blessings that may be used within a regular church service to bless same-sex relationships. They recognise the diversity within the church family and affirm the love, commitment and fidelity present in those relationships. The PLF do not constitute a form of marriage. The Church of England continues to uphold the doctrine that Holy Matrimony may only exist between one man and one woman. The blessings do not change that. 10 After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go.²He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. ³Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. ⁴ Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. ⁵ Whatever house you enter, first say, "Peace to this house!" ⁶ And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. ⁷ Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. 8 Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; ⁹ cure the sick who are there, and say to them, "The kingdom of God has come near to you. ¹⁰ But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, ¹¹ "Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near."¹² I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town.
