FOODBANK

Did you know that St Johns helps two stages of the provision to support people struggling to feed their families? Some people find it easier to give a cash donation rather than shop for food items. These financial donations are shared between the Epsom and Ewell Foodbank and the Epsom Pantry.

Epsom Pantry is a welcoming community hub built around food. As well as offering access to affordable and healthy groceries, Epsom Pantry provides information and advice, opportunities to volunteer and learn new skills and a network of support. It is a means of strengthening members' financial and emotional resilience while also helping to reduce the dependency on food banks. It differs from food banks as it is not a crisis provision; instead, it is a community food shop run by and for its members.

If you prefer to provide items for the Foodbank this week they need: Jars of cooking sauce, Instant Mash, Long life Sponge puddings, Custard, Packet soup, Chocolate spread, Chocolate bars, Crisps, Gluten free items, Toilet rolls, Shaving Foam, Washing powder or pods, Baby toiletries (shampoo, body wash etc).

Today's Services

The 9.30am Communion this week is a Prayers for Healing service. The 11am service is also Communion. The theme for Sunday's final session on the Book of James is 'Prayers of Faith'. James urges prayer in all circumstances, highlights faith's healing power and generally encourages church members to support and correct each other in mutual love. What does it mean for us today to be 'family'? And how can we grow together as disciples of Jesus?

Faithful Creator, whose mercy never fails: deepen our faithfulness to you and to your living Word, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Readings

James 5:13-20

¹³ Are any among you suffering? They should pray. Are any cheerful? They should sing songs of praise. ¹⁴ Are any among you sick? They should call for the elders of the church and have them pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord. ¹⁵ The prayer of faith will save the sick, and the Lord will raise them up; and anyone who has committed sins will be forgiven. ¹⁶ Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, so that you may be healed. The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective. ¹⁷ Elijah was a human being like us, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. ¹⁸ Then he prayed again, and the heaven gave rain and the earth yielded its harvest. ¹⁹ My brothers and sisters, if anyone among you wanders from the truth and is brought back by another, ²⁰ you should know that whoever brings back a sinner from wandering will save the sinner's soul from death and will cover a multitude of sins.

Matthew 18:15-22

¹⁵ 'If another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone. If the member listens to you, you have regained that one. ¹⁶ But if you are not listened to, take one or two others along with you, so that every word may be confirmed by the evidence of two or three witnesses. ¹⁷ If the member refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church; and if the offender refuses to listen even to the church, let such a one be to you as a Gentile and a taxcollector. ¹⁸ Truly I tell you, whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven. ¹⁹ Again, truly I tell you, if two of you agree on earth about anything you ask, it will be done for you by my Father in heaven.²⁰ For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them.' ²¹ Then Peter came and said to him, 'Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?' ²² Jesus said to him. 'Not seven times, but, I tell vou, seventyseven times.
