FOODBANK

"The foodbank was there when we really needed it, it was an absolute lifeline."

In June they fed 603 people, 250 were children. This is 110 less than June 2023. They have a total of 258 crates of food in the warehouse, which is 24 less than last week and nearly 175 less than this time last year.

This week they urgently need: Sweetcorn, Cooking Sauces (tomato, curry etc), Rice, Tinned Vegetables, Tinned Fruit, Long life Milk (full fat or semi skimmed), Dried Noodles (not pot or instant), Long Life Juice, Squash, Long life Sponge puddings, Shampoo & Conditioner (they have none), Washing Powder, Nappies 6 & 6+

They also need: Weetabix, Biscuits, Sugar (500g bags please), Custard, Rice Pudding, Ketchup & Mayonnaise, Strong shopping bags and bags for life. Thank you

BIBLE READING RESOURCES

Philip asked the Ethiopian, "Do you understand what you are reading?" He said he did not ("How can I understand unless I have a teacher to teach me?") and asked Philip to explain the text to him. Acts 8: 30-31, 34

I recently picked up the Tynedale commentary on the Letters of John by John R.W. Stott as I was sorely missing my collection of Tom Wright's New Testament for Everyone series. The Tynedale commentary is perhaps heavier going but, nevertheless, I did find it useful to explain a few passages which had got me wondering. No one has mentioned Scripture Union or SPCK materials that are available, so we've written to them to request some examples for you to see in the exhibition. Today's Services

Rev Rosemary will kick off our Summer Psalms with a look at Psalm 139, a beautiful depiction of God's intimate knowledge of each of us and his deep love. The psalm asks rhetorically, *'Where can I go from your spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence?'* The answer, of course, is nowhere. But who would want to flee from the God who has loved us unconditionally from the womb?

First Reading

Psalm 139

- ¹ You have searched me, LORD, and you know me.
- ² You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar.
- ³ You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways.
- ⁴Before a word is on my tongue you, LORD, know it completely.
- ⁵ You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me.
- ⁶ Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.
- ⁷ Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence?
- ⁸ If I go up to the heavens, you are there; if I make my bed in the depths, you are there.
- ⁹ If I rise on the wings of the dawn, if I settle on the far side of the sea,
- ¹⁰ even there your hand will guide me, your right hand will hold me fast.
- ¹¹ If I say, 'Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,'
- ¹² even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you.
- ¹³ For you created my inmost being;
- you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- ¹⁴ I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.
- ¹⁵ My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.
- ¹⁶ Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.
- ¹⁷ How precious to me are your thoughts¹ God!
 How vast is the sum of them!
- ¹⁸ Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand – when I awake, I am still with you.

- ¹⁹ If only you, God, would slay the wicked! Away from me, you who are bloodthirsty!
- ²⁰ They speak of you with evil intent; your adversaries misuse your name.
- ²¹ Do I not hate those who hate you, LORD, and abhor those who are in rebellion against you?
- ²² I have nothing but hatred for them; I count them my enemies.
- ²³ Search me, God, and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts.
- ²⁴ See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting.

Gospel Reading

Matthew 10:24-31

²⁴ 'The student is not above the teacher, nor a servant above his master. ²⁵ It is enough for students to be like their teachers, and servants like their masters. If the head of the house has been called Beelzebul, how much more the members of his household! ²⁶ 'So do not be afraid of them, for there is nothing concealed that will not be disclosed, or hidden that will not be made known. ²⁷ What I tell you in the dark, speak in the daylight; what is whispered in your ear, proclaim from the roofs. ²⁸ Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell. ²⁹ Are not two sparrows sold for a penny? Yet not one of them will fall to the ground outside your Father's care. ³⁰ And even the very hairs of your head are all numbered. ³¹ So don't be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows.
