Today's Services

Many of you will remember the 1981 movie, Chariots of Fire. It tells the story of Eric Liddell, a sprinter from Scotland who was a favourite to win the 1924 Olympic 100m race. When he learned that the heats would be held on a Sunday, he refused to run. He switched to the 200m and 400m and won two medals. After the games he eschewed fame and celebrity to become a missionary in China. His life is testimony to his singular focus on serving God despite the pressure to compromise. Psalm 27 declares 'One thing I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life'. Eric Liddell clearly knew first place belonged to God. What comes first for us?
