Today's Services

Last week we heard the account of God's good creation being attacked by the craft serpent, Satan. Adam and Eve's resulting disobedience led successive generations to move further and further from God, 'East of Eden', in sinful rebellion. What would God do now? This week's instalment, 'The Seed of Promise', focuses in on Abraham, through whom God will begin the process of leading humanity back to himself. God's plan for redemption will rest on a very old man and his very old wife. Once again, we learn that God works through unlikely people...the only qualification required is faith and a willingness to obey.

12 The LORD had said to Abram, 'Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you. ² 'I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. ³ I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you

reward.' ² But Abram said, 'Sovereign LORD, what can you give me since I remain childless and the one who will inherit my estate is Eliezer of Damascus?' ³ And Abram said, 'You have given me no children; so a servant in my household will be my heir.' ⁴ Then the word of the LORD came to him: 'This man will not be your heir, but a son who is your own flesh and blood will be your heir.' ⁵ He took him outside and said, 'Look up at the sky and count the stars – if indeed you can count them.' Then he said to him, 'So shall your offspring be. ⁶ Abram believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

³¹ To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, 'If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. ³² Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.' ³³ They answered him, 'We are Abraham's descendants and have never been slaves of anyone. How can you say that we shall be set free?' ³⁴ Jesus replied, 'Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. ³⁵ Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it for ever. ³⁶ So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed. ³⁷ I know you are Abraham's descendants. Yet you are looking for a way to kill me, because you have no room for my word. ³⁸ I am telling you what I have seen in the Father's presence, and you are doing what you have heard from your father.
