Today's Services

After last week's break for Harvest we return once again to The God Story. At the end of the last session we saw how Moses led the people of Israel out of slavery in Egypt and through the wilderness for 40 years. This week, we take a fast walk through about 800 years of Israel's rise & fall, from entering the Promised Land to the halcyon years of David and Solomon and the decline that followed. Throughout the story, we see how the success or failure of Israel and its leaders depended upon their faithfulness or rejection of God. With a particular focus on David, we gain an insight into the kind of characteristics and behaviours that please God. How can we maintain our focus on our faith in God through Christ?

The 9.30am service this week includes Prayers for Healing.

Readings

1 Samuel 16:1-13 Lynne Coppin

16 The LORD said to Samuel, 'How long will you mourn for Saul, since I have rejected him as king over Israel? Fill your horn with oil and be on your way; I am sending you to Jesse of Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king.' ² But Samuel said, 'How can I go? If Saul hears about it, he will kill me.' The LORD said, 'Take a heifer with you and say, "I have come to sacrifice to the LORD." ³ Invite Jesse to the sacrifice,

and I will show you what to do. You are to anoint for me the one I indicate.' 4 Samuel did what the LORD said. When he arrived at Bethlehem, the elders of the town trembled when they met him. They asked, 'Do you come in peace?' 5 Samuel replied, 'Yes, in peace; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD. Consecrate yourselves and come to the sacrifice with me.' Then he consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice. ⁶ When they arrived, Samuel saw Eliab and thought, 'Surely the LORD's anointed stands here before the LORD.' ⁷ But the LORD said to Samuel, 'Do not consider his appearance or his height, for I have rejected him. The LORD does not look at the things people look at. People look at the outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart.' 8 Then Jesse called Abinadab and made him pass in front of Samuel. But Samuel said, 'The LORD has not chosen this one either.'9 Jesse then made Shammah pass by, but Samuel said, 'Nor has the LORD chosen this one.' 10 Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, but Samuel said to him, 'The LORD has not chosen these.' 11 So he asked Jesse, 'Are these all the sons you have?' 'There is still the youngest,' Jesse answered. 'He is tending the sheep.' Samuel said, 'Send for him; we will not sit down until he arrives.' 12 So he sent for him and had him brought in. He was glowing with health and had a fine appearance and handsome features. Then the LORD said, 'Rise and anoint him; this is the one.' 13 So Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers, and from that day on the Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon David. Samuel then went to Ramah.

Luke 6:43-45

⁴³ 'No good tree bears bad fruit, nor does a bad tree bear good fruit. ⁴⁴ Each tree is recognised by its own fruit. People do not pick figs from thorn-bushes, or grapes from briers. ⁴⁵ A good man brings good things out of the good stored up in his heart, and an evil man brings evil things out of the evil stored up in his heart. For the mouth speaks what the heart is full of.
