Today's Services

After celebrating Christmas rather early last week, The God Story now turns to Jesus' three years of public ministry. Jesus emerged on the public stage, and picked up on the theme that his cousin, John the Baptist had initiated: 'Repent, for the kingdom of God is near!' The kingdom was embodied in Jesus the King. As a teacher, preacher, healer and miracle-worker, Jesus demonstrated the values of the kingdom and taught his disciples to do the same. What it would look like if God's will and God's ways became a reality in our families, communities, and the world at large? This Sunday also happens to be the first in Kingdom season, the final season in the church year that celebrates Christ the King. Red is the liturgical colour for the next month.

⁶ For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. ⁷ Of the greatness of his government and peace there will be no end. He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom, establishing and upholding it with justice and righteousness from that time on and for ever. The zeal of the LORD Almighty will accomplish this.

Matthew 4:1-20

4 Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to by the devil. 2 After fasting for forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. 3 The tempter came to him and said, 'If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread.' 4 Jesus answered, 'It is written: "Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God." 5 Then the devil took him to the holy city and set him on the highest point of the temple. 6 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down. For it is written: "He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone. 7 Jesus answered him, 'It is also written: "Do not put the Lord your God to the test." 8 Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendour. ⁹ 'All this I will give you,' he said, 'if you will bow down and worship me.' ¹⁰ Jesus said to him, 'Away from me, Satan! For it is written: "Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only" 11 Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him. 12 When Jesus heard that John had been put in prison, he withdrew to Galilee. 13 Leaving Nazareth, he went and lived in Capernaum, which was by the lake in the area of Zebulun and Naphtali – ¹⁴ to fulfil what was said through the prophet Isaiah: ¹⁵ 'Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the Way of the Sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles – 16 the people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned.' 17 From that time on Jesus began to preach, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.' 18 As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. 19 'Come, follow me.' Jesus said, 'and I will send you out to fish for people.' 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.
