Today's Services

This Advent we will be 'Journeying With Luke' based on a series of reflections written by theologian Tom Wright. On this first Sunday of Advent our theme will be 'A Time for Encouragement'. Appropriately for a day that will include a baptism in the 11am service, the Bible passage looks at Jesus' baptism which Luke embellishes with Jesus' extensive family tree. What emerges from this passage are answers to questions about where Jesus came from, who he is, and where's he's going. As we think about our own Christian journey, it's a good time to reflect on those questions for ourselves.
