FOODBANK

Please pick up a Foodbank Flier from the welcome desk. It lists the items needed to make up the Christmas parcels. All the packing and preparations are done by the volunteers on top of their regular work in maintaining food assistance to those that need it - consequently you'll see that they ask for these items by 10th December please. Cash donations will be used for fresh meat and vegetable vouchers or gift cards to enable the families who are having a particularly hard time to get a present for their children.

They also need these items to maintain regular stocks:- Cooking Sauces, Beans/Pasta with Meat, Packet Soup, Instant Mash, Squash, Ketchup/Brown Sauce, Marmalade/Honey/Chocolate Spread, Sugar (500gr), Rice Pudding, Chocolate Biscuit Bars, Long life Sponge Puddings, Crisps, Deodorant (Male/Female), Shaving Foam, Adult Toothbrushes, Tampons, Washing Up Liquid, Washing Powder.

They are also desperate for:- Loo Rolls, Powdered Milk, Long Life Juice.

This is an expensive time for everyone so we are particularly grateful for all your support.

Today's Services

After three years of public ministry, three years of proclaiming and demonstrating the Kingdom of God, Jesus ministry climaxes with seven days that changed history. We call that week leading up to the Resurrection, 'The Passion', and it is so important that all four gospel writers devote at least one third of their entire books to those eventful days. God's plan for the restoration of creation and the salvation of humankind is finally revealed in our suffering Saviour. We have all been invited the join the Eternal Family. How do we make that truth an ongoing reality in our lives?

Isaiah 53:11-12

After he has suffered, he will see the light of life and be satisfied; by his knowledge my righteous servant will justify many, and he will bear their iniquities. ¹² Therefore I will give him a portion among the great, and he will divide the spoils with the strong, because he poured out his life unto death, and was numbered with the transgressors. For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Luke 23:44-46; 50-56; and 24:1-8

⁴⁴ It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, ⁴⁵ for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶ Jesus called out with a loud voice, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit.' When he had said this, he breathed his last.

⁵⁰ Now there was a man named Joseph, a member of the Council, a good and upright man, ⁵¹ who had not consented to their decision and action. He came from the Judean town of Arimathea, and he himself was waiting for the kingdom of God. ⁵² Going to Pilate, he asked for Jesus' body. ⁵³ Then he took it down, wrapped it in linen cloth and placed it in a tomb cut in the rock, one in which no one had yet been laid. ⁵⁴ It was Preparation Day, and the Sabbath was about to begin.

⁵⁵ The women who had come with Jesus from Galilee followed Joseph and saw the tomb and how his body was laid in it. ⁵⁶ Then they went home and prepared spices and perfumes. But they rested on the Sabbath in obedience to the commandment.

24 On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. ² They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³ but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ While they were wondering about this, suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. ⁵ In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? ⁶ He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: ⁷ "The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again." ⁸ Then they remembered his words.the Sabbath in obedience to the commandment.
