FOODBANK

First of all, thank you everyone for your generosity and support. There was so much to deliver to the Foodbank this week that one of the church's neighbours got her car out and took us down to the Foodbank with it. A special thank you to this kind lady who will know who she is.

The good news from the Foodbank is that they have now launched their 'Choose Your Food' model at the Ewell Foodbank. Instead of volunteers packing for the clients, they invite people to select their food, with volunteers on hand to offer help if needed.

This week they **Urgently** need (because they have none or stocks are dangerously low): Instant Coffee, Chocolate Spread/Peanut Butter, Crisps, Custard, Long Life Sponge Puddings, Biscuits Deodorant (male and female), Shower Gel, Shampoo and Conditioner, Washing up Liquid, Washing Powder

They also need the following to maintain stocks please: Cooking Sauces, Tea bags, Squash, Ketchup/Mayonnaise/Brown Sauce, Sugar (500gr), Tinned Fruit, Savoury Biscuits, Chocolate Biscuit Bars, Adult Toothpaste, Kids Toothpaste, Sanitary Towels/Tampons, Shaving Foam. Thank you.

This week we celebrate Mother's Day (or more accurately, Mothering Sunday). In a happy and - I'd like to think divinely inspired - confluence of themes, Mother's Day coincides with the fourth instalment of our Lentwise series which this Sunday is based on Jesus the Gate and the Good Shepherd, metaphors that speak to shelter and protection. Although we usually use male pronouns for God, the Bible frequently uses female imagery to describe the nurturing and protective love of God (see the Old Testament readings, for example). Whatever our personal experience, mothers are known for being fiercely protective of their offspring. Jesus shows us that this is even more so true of God toward all those who look to him (her) for refuge.

They will come in and go out, and find pasture. 10 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full. 11 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. 12 The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. 13 The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. 14 'I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me - 15 just as the Father knows me and I know the Father and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷ The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life – only to take it up again.
