And those who come to church for the Lenten services will be able to collect a little box representing 'spiritual essentials' as we think about who Jesus is based on readings in John's gospel. In these unsettling times, let's recall Jesus' words to his disciples: "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have Rev. Geoff Andrew overcome the world." (John 16:33)

FOODBANK

Have you picked up a Lent leaflet for the Good Company - which includes the Foodbank- from the Welcome Desk? Even if you are unable to support the Foodbank with donations your prayers are really needed as they try to support people in financial hardship. We only asked them for 45 leaflets so hope that we do not waste them, 45 people's prayers could make a huge difference.

In February they supported 465 people, 191 of those were children.

Sunday's Services

In this first Sunday of Lent, our theme is Finding Direction. Thomas' despairing question to Jesus – "Lord, we don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?" – was answered by Jesus with one of his most famous pronouncements: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." What does it mean for us to head in the direction of Jesus? Those who come to one of our services on Sunday will receive a little compass as a memory aid. The 9.30am service is a Prayers for Healing service and there is Communion at 11am.

³ Strengthen the feeble hands, steady the knees that give way; ⁴ say to those with fearful hearts, 'Be strong, do not fear; your God will come, he will come with vengeance; with divine retribution he will come to save you.' ⁵ Then will the eyes of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. ⁶ Then will the lame leap like a deer, and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert. ⁷ The burning sand will become a pool, the thirsty ground bubbling springs. In the haunts where jackals once lay, grass and reeds and papyrus will grow. ⁸ And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way.
