'WE BELIEVE' CREED BOOKLETS

This year marks the 1700-year anniversary of the Council of Nicaea which met in the year 325AD to discuss matters of Christian doctrine. The most significant outcome of this meeting was the formulation of one of the foundational statements of Christian belief, the Nicene Creed, which we still use in our churches today. To commemorate this anniversary, the Church has produced a booklet of 24 daily reflections covering each line of the Creed. We have purchased a limited supply of these booklets for St John's and they are available at the welcome desk for a suggested donation of £3.

Sunday's Services

The Easter season reaches its climax 50 days after the resurrection of Jesus with the festival of Pentecost. Jesus promised his disciples that after he had ascended to heaven (10 days before Pentecost) they would each receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came in power. The disciples were propelled into the streets, proclaiming the Good News about Jesus in the native languages of all those gathering in Jerusalem for the festival. The same Holy Spirit is available to us today. The Spirit continues to empower, comfort, guide and teach us in our walk with Jesus. But we should remember that the Spirit is given principally for mission. And the trajectory of mission is always outward: Telling, Teaching, Tending, Transforming and Treasuring in the name of Jesus to bring about the Kingdom of heaven on earth.

Today's 9.30am service includes Prayer for Healing and the 11am service includes Communion.

Readings

Acts 2:1-21

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. ⁵ Now there were staying in Jerusalem God-fearing Jews from every nation under heaven. ⁶ When they heard this sound, a crowd came together in bewilderment, because each one heard their own language being spoken. ⁷ Utterly amazed, they asked: 'Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸ Then how is it that

each of us hears them in our native language? 9 Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰ Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome ¹¹ (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs – we hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!' 12 Amazed and perplexed, they asked one another, 'What does this mean?' 13 Some, however, made fun of them and said, 'They have had too much wine.' 14 Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd: 'Fellow Jews and all of you who live in Jerusalem, let me explain this to you; listen carefully to what I say. ¹⁵ These people are not drunk, as you suppose. It's only nine in the morning! 16 No, this is what was spoken by the prophet Joel: 17 "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. 18 Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. ¹⁹ I will show wonders in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and billows of smoke, ²⁰ The sun will be turned to darkness and the moon to blood before the coming of the great and glorious day of the Lord. 21 And everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Luke 4:16-21

¹⁶ He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, ¹⁷ and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: ¹⁸ 'The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, ¹⁹ to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' ²⁰ Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. ²¹ He began by saying to them, 'Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing.'
